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### Ways to Build Math Understanding at Home



Math is everywhere and I mean everywhere. Think of one thing in your kitchen that involves math. Did you say measuring cups, measuring spoons, temperature for the oven? These are a few things that come to mind when I think of math at home. I would like to challenge you discuss math in your everyday routine. Below are a few with which you can start:

Cook a Meal - Just imagine all of the math you both can discuss while baking a cake. Are you doubling the recipe? Put your little one in charge of making sweet tea for everyone.

The Tally Board - Count how many jumping jacks or sprints you can do in a set amount of time. Gather that information and make a tally chart, a bar graph, or/and even a line graph.

Sorting the utensils drawer - When washing and drying dishes, have your child sort the utensils into the appropriate place.

Creating a garden - Grow a small garden measuring the seed's growth. Sunflowers grow pretty tall! Take a chance and grow them in a plant pot.

February was short, but it was filled with wonderful opportunities to engage in literacy. All students received tote bags filled with books and goodies courtesy of MailChimp. We had an amazing Literacy and Math Night. We ended the month with the Black History Wax Museum, where students shared their research and essays about significant African-Americans in history. The month of March will prove to be just as exciting as students write poems for the International Peace Poetry Contest. March is National Reading Month. Ways to celebrate at home include rereading a favorite book, reading a story in a silly voice, starting a new book series, reading to an older or younger sibling... the possibilities are endless! Be on the lookout for more ways to celebrate throughout the month.

During the month of March, your child(ren) will take the final MAP Growth Reading and Math (K-5), MAP Reading Fluency (K-3), and Narrative Write Score (3-5) assessments. Please encourage your scholar to remain focused and be sure they understand the question that is being asked. Remind them to use dialogue in their writing and end their narratives with a strong conclusion. We have worked hard all year and your children are ready to show what they know.

As always, please read to, and with, your child for at least 20 minutes every day. Reading with children improves their fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension skills. What better month to commit to reading than National Reading Month!
