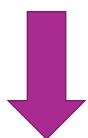
Where We Are

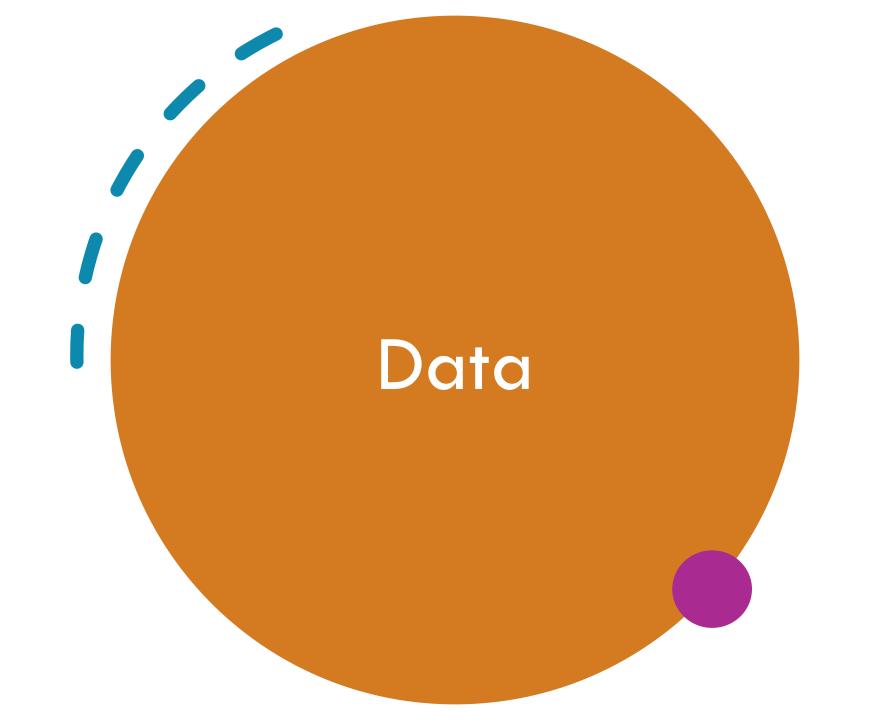

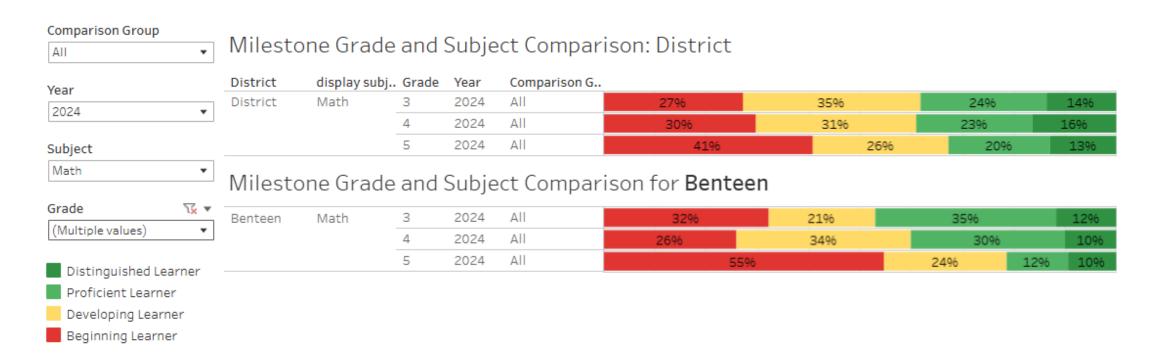


GA Milestones Math Results (Overall) APS vs. Benteen

Our Overarching Needs

Literacy: Increase the percent of the GMAS assessments in ELA by 3%.

Numeracy: Increase the percent of students scoring proficient and above on students scoring proficient and above on the GMAS assessments in math by 3%.

Whole Child & Student Support: Increase the ADA by at least 2% for students to support their academic achievement.

SMART Goals (Elementary)

Literacy

By May 2025, Benteen will Increase the percent of students scoring proficient and above on the ELA EOG assessment by 3% from 29% (2023) to 32% (2025). Subgoal: Decrease the percent of students scoring in the beginning category by at least 5%.

Numeracy

By May 2025, Benteen will increase the percent of students scoring proficient and above on the Math EOG assessment by 3% from 28% (2023) to 31% (2025). Subgoal: Decrease the percent of students scoring in the beginning category by at least 5%.

Whole Child & Intervention

While the ADA for the school is higher that the district ADA, there is still some improvement to be done to get students at school to positively impact their achievement. By May 2025, Benteen will increase the ADA of students by 3% from 92% (2023) to 95% (2025).

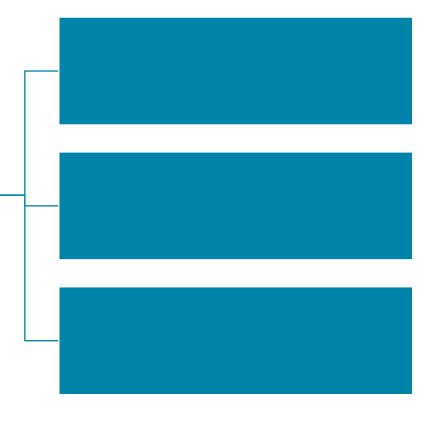

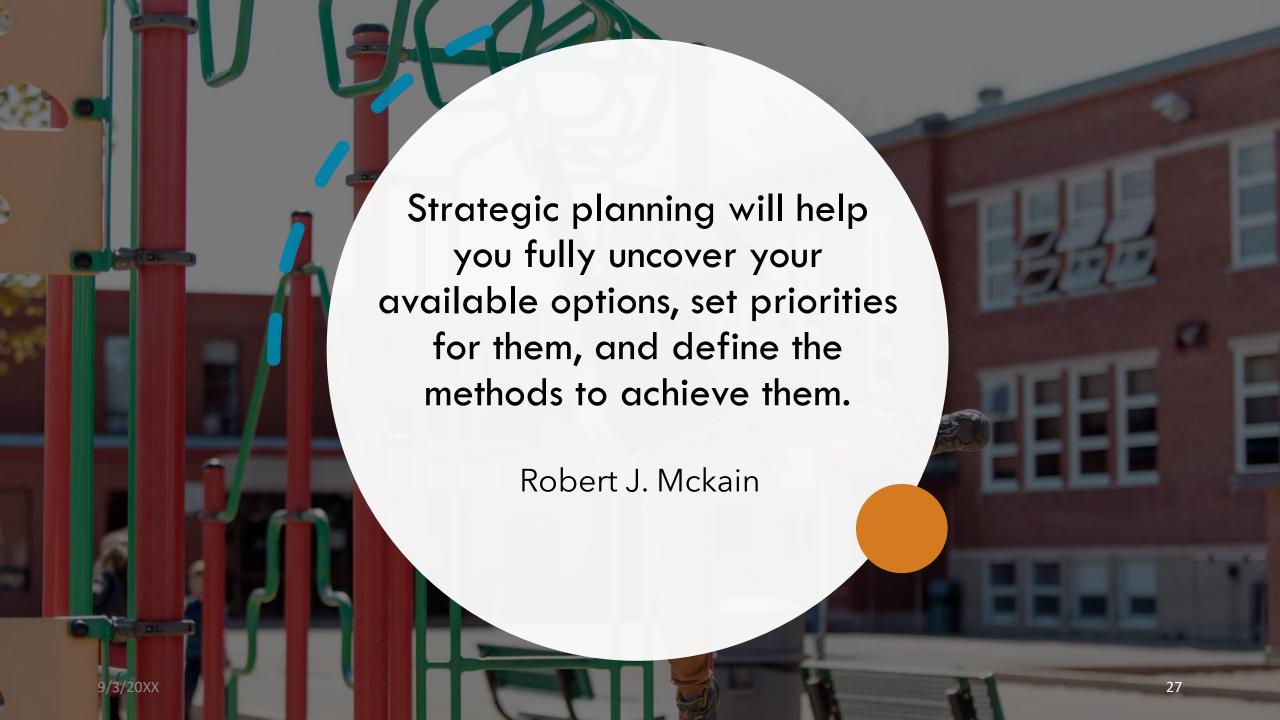
