IV. Discussion Items

a. **Discussion Item 1**: 45-day Continuous Improvement Plan check-in Shavaun Mincey presented updates on the 45-day Continuous Improvement plan and reviewed actions steps to achieve the following goals:

- Literacy SMART Goal move students from 55% to 58% on the GMAS assessment
- ii. Math SMART Goal move students from 41% to 44% on the GMAS assessment
- iii. Whole child intervention SMART Goal decrease incidents by 5% from 52 incidents to 49 incidents in 2024-2025 school year
 - 1. We are currently at 19 incidents. Expect to see increase in the spring impacted by "spring fever."



- b. **Discussion Item 2**: Fall to Winter MAP data
 - i. Shavaun Mincey reviewed MAP data from Fall & Winter testing for all grades (see attached data)
 - ii. Shavaun Mincey reviewed CCRPI Georgia information (see attached data)
 - iii. Group discussion was held to ask questions and share reflections on the current data:
 - 1. How do you think things are going? Are you surprised? Shavaun Mincey shared the following thoughts:
 - Yes, surprised that the rate of growth is lower than previous years. Working out how coaches can tag-team – run PLCs while also being in the classroom.
 - b. High growth does not necessarily mean achievement; high growth on GMAS is difficult to maintain.
 - c. 13 classes are currently meeting their growth target.
 - d. We have the right people in the building and our students are more than capable of achievement.
 - e. Demographics of students stays the same 20% of population is transient; several new teachers this year and it's their first time participating in MAP assessments.
 - 2. Notice that growth in math is mostly in the yellow; 4th grade went down in achievement. How would you explain this?
 - a. Shift in lesson plan creators this year; if we can get an expert in each subject, we can ensure high quality lessons.
 - 3. Sustainability of Ms. Mincey meeting with teachers outside of school hours?
 - a. This is an area of great success, passion, and responsibility of Ms. Mincey's, but she will be concluding this extra work in January.
 - 4. Notice that 2nd grade reading has large increase in achievement
 - a. 2nd grade teachers have shown dedication to setting clear goals and working towards them.
 - 5. Why are predictions for Winter 2024-2025 lower than Fall 2024-2025?
 - a. This is a puzzle. Upcoming teacher meetings will provide insights.
 - 6. From a teacher's perspective, what is the atmosphere/climate at the school right now? Michael Armstrong shared the following:
 - Teachers are motivated to continue the work they are doing and will make needed adjustments to reach every



student. We know the talent and ability to grow is there – and we will discover how we can unlock this.

- 7. Is the recommendation to focus on level predictions because they are most accurate?
 - a. Correct. If students are in the yellow, this means there is a lot of opportunity to move them in the right direction. Most grade levels talked about learning strategies from each other, continue building teacher tool kits to move student outcomes.
 - Grade by grade, reading is seeing improvement while math is slower to improve. Reading is the super-power for Bolton, which is why we've chosen to focus on improving math achievement.
- 8. How confident are you that you've gotten to the root cause of the issues?
 - Still looking at data and individual student patterns to identify commonalities that we can replicate and leverage with other students.
 - b. Plan to get additional information from teachers, as well.
- c. **Discussion Item 3**: Strategic Plan Progress
 - i. Shavaun Mincey reviewed school priorities for 2021-2026 strategic plan and shared progress made to date.
 - ii. The group identified updates that should be made to the strategic plan
 - 1. Shavaun Mincey will need to edit Eureka and balance literacy language in strategic plan.
- d. **Discussion Item 4**: Ranking Strategic Plan priorities
 - Shavaun Mincey reviewed the strategic plan priorities ranking from Spring 2024.
 - ii. Group discussed and identified changes that should be made for 2025.
 - iii. The group recommends flipping priorities 9 and 6.

- All Cluster Advisory Teams met as a group in November. This meeting featured APS administration who oversee the athletics program across the district.

 - i. The 2025 APS budget is facing a \$1Million deficit. Anything the district funds will need a clear, substantial connection to student outcomes
 - ii. Recruiting DLI teachers for upper grades
 - iii. Math books and curriculum
 - iv. Communications with between families and APS
