Needs Assessment

During this Needs Assessment, we will look at data from the Spring MAPS administration and identify 2-3 potential needs for the 2024-2025 school year.

This discussion will help school leadership as they complete the school's 2024-2025 Continuous Improvement Plan.

Needs Assessment: Guiding Questions

- What does this data tell us?
- What good news is there to celebrate?
- Where are growth opportunities?
- What trends do we see in the data?



Needs Assessment: Guiding Questions

What does this data tell us?

- We are moving in the right direction in reading, however, we must continue work in this area to see significant increase in the percent of students toward proficiency and above.
- Math is an outlier. We must continue to learn the new standards and curriculum in order for students to achieve growth and proficiency.

• What good news is there to celebrate?

- MAP Growth spring report predicts we will meet our reading CIP goal for GMAS. The goal was to have a 3% increase in students scoring proficient or above from 22.3% to 25.3%.
 MAP results show 27% at proficient.
- We exceeded the MAP growth target goal in reading. The goal was to move from 38% to 41% meeting/exceeding MAP reading goal. MAP results show 57%
- 75% of Hispanics met their fall to spring growth targets/goals in reading, 63% exceeded in math.
- Overall for reading with SWDs, 50% exceeded their growth target compared to the

	SMART Goals (Elementary and Middle Schools)	
The percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient or above on the GA Milestones Literacy Assessment will increase from 22.3% to 25.3%. The percentage of students in grades K-5 that met their fall-to-spring growth goal on MAP Reading will increase from 38% to 41% in May 2024.	The percentage of students in grades 3-5 scoring proficient or above on the GA Milestones Math Assessment will increase from 18.8% to 21.8%. The percentage of students in grades K-5 that met their fall-to-spring growth goal on Math MAP will increase from 41% to 44% in May 2024.	The amount of OSS days will decrease by .10 points.



Needs Assessment: Guiding Questions

- What trends do we see in the data?
 - In math, a larger percentage of students were at the beginning level in the spring as compared to fall at the district & school level.
 - o The gap is closing between Hispanics and All Students in reading.
 - o The gap is closing between SWDs and All Students in math.
 - At the school and district level, the percentage of students flagged for reading increased from fall to spring. However, the percent of students who moved to oral reading (fluent) increased by 8%.
 - o What are growth opportunities?
 - o Continue to internalize new math curriculum and materials.
 - o Devise a strategic plan to address non-readers through the science of reading and strengthen writing skills.


