IV. Discussion Items

- a. Budget Review
 - For 2020-2021 school year, the primary focus is to increase the achievement subgroups; Social Emotional Learning Brain Breaks (recess); Increase the rigor in instruction and implementing IB with fidelity; Reading class (address struggling readers); Chorus Class (more opportunities for Connections)
 - ii. Title I and Family Engagement -\$86,000 reserved

- Money can be used for Saturday workshop with parents and students -One of the goals is to improve reading and writing; possible factors include pay teacher stipends, transportation for students, purchase materials for writer's workshop, and possible utilize contracted services

- \$208, 000 is allotted for Amplify Text for Language Arts. King, Long, Sylvan, and Brown has agreed to utilize the same language arts curriculum resource
- iv. Current budget is \$9,498,130; this includes an increase of enrollment and increased poverty. The projected enrollment is 888 students.
 Approximately 24% is students with disabilities. Six hundred twenty four students are considered poverty.
- v. Added or changed positions included in the budget are a registrar instead of two secretaries, a reading teacher, a chorus teacher, four paraprofessionals to support and monitor recess, an assistant principal to focus on curriculum and implementation of IB.
- vi. Mr. Brown will meet with the Area Superintendent to present the budget.

b. Strategic Plan Update

The team reviewed the suggested changes made to the strategic plan. Added to the plan included White subgroup, Playworks (recess), Artifact Tuesday. Math platforms that are no longer used were removed. Also, a three year plan was revised.
