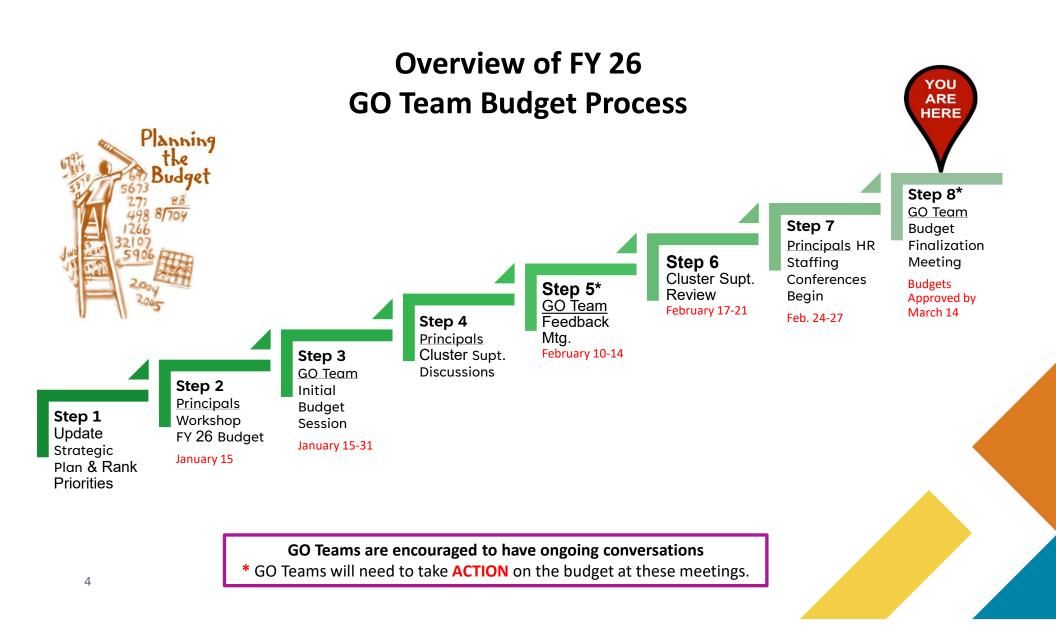

There were not any changes made to the draft budget we discussed at our last meeting.

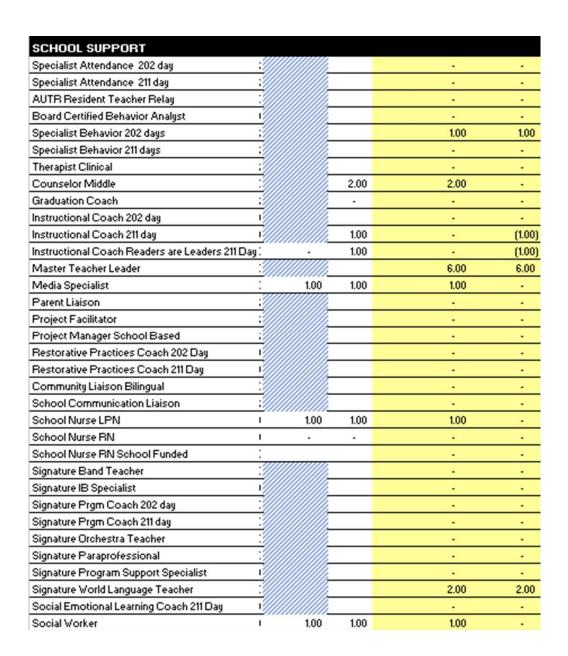


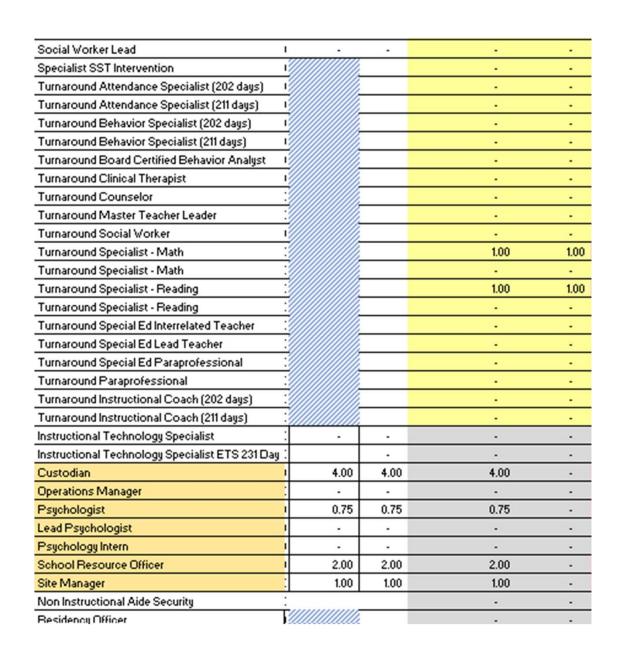

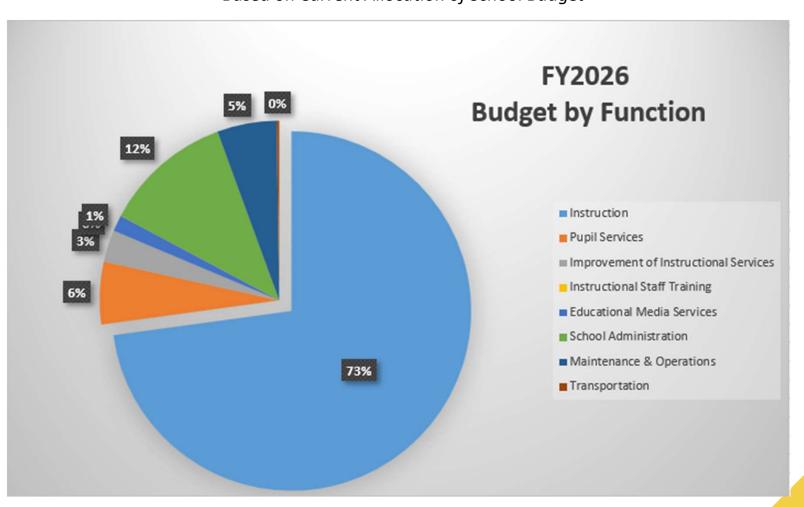

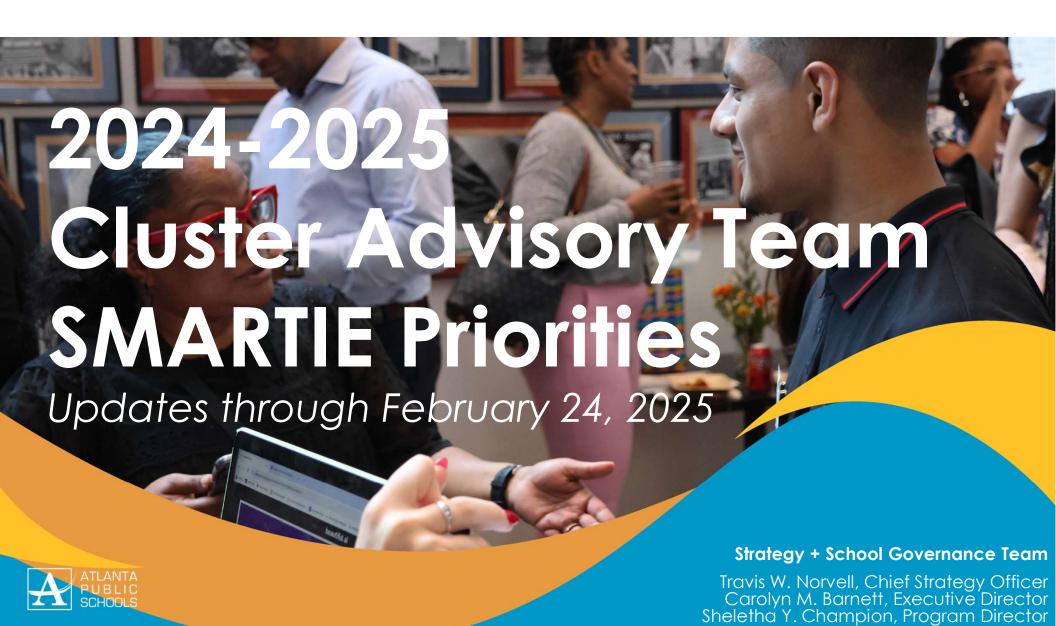
