



Midtown's 2024 Georgia Department of Education Recognition

- **AP School of Distinction:** Schools with at least 20% of the total student population taking AP exams and at least 50% of all AP exams earning scores of 3 or higher.
- **AP STEM Achievement:** AP STEM schools (see above definition) with at least 50% of all AP STEM exams earning scores of 3 or higher.
- AP STEM School: Schools with a minimum of five students testing in at least four AP STEM courses, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Statistics, AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Environmental Science, AP Physics 1, AP Physics 2, AP Physics C, AP Computer Science A, AP Computer Science Principles, and a minimum of 25 exams administered
- **AP Humanities:** Schools with at least five exams administered in each of the following AP categories: one ELA course, two social studies courses, one fine arts course, and one world language course and a minimum of 25 total exams administered



Midtown's Class of 2024

- \$26,175,384 in scholarships
- 67% HOPE-eligible scholars (255 students with a GPA of 3.0+)
- Zell Miller: 120 students with a GPA of 3.7+
- Overall college acceptance rate: 80%
 - University of Georgia (UGA) acceptance rate: 73 out of 146 total applicants (50% acceptance rate; 42% is average UGA acceptance rate)
 - Georgia Institute of Technology acceptance rate: 33 out of 95 total applicants (35% acceptance rate; 22% is average GA Tech acceptance rate)
