

Construction Updates


New Building Addition: Expected time of completion: June 30, 2021

Considerations

Instructional

The teacher instructing students who are both in-person and virtual

In-school Instruction will still rely heavily on technology

Example: Zoom, Google Classroom, virtual group work; continued focus on paperless submission; Nearpod, etc.

The bell schedule will be 8:30-3:30 for ALL students (Beginning Feb. 1)

Logistical/Operational Considerations

- *Masks all day
- *Limited hallway movement
- *Restricted hallway movement
- *Breakfast and lunch in classrooms and/or other defined outdoor locations
- *No lockers
- *No sharing food/drinks
- *Maintain physical distance from friends and faculty
- *Social distancing
- -On buses: Fill in from back seats to front seats; social distancing cannot be guaranteed
- -Be prepared to take BUS, WALK, or get PICKED-UP by 3:45 pm EVERY DAY

Screening with temperature checks and questions will occur daily. The students will enter through one entrance. After entering, students will report directly to their first period class


Students arriving on site from WBL,

Media Center and computer labs are closed. Students will continue to have access to virtual books.

Students will be in class for the entire period including lunch.

Teacher and Teaching

The teachers that will return to the building or remain virtual is unknown.



- Teachers will be teaching simultaneously (both virtually and face-to-face)
- Classes will be at least 75 minutes per period
- 3 Students will be navigating a lot of independence and new protocols/guidelines. Restrictions will be in place for health and safety of all.

Summer school offerings have not been determined at this time. PSAT is tentatively scheduled for January 26th (11th graders and tentatively 10th graders depending on logistics)

Protocols

Face to face: all staff and students will wear masks at all times except during lunch.

Lunch will be in class. Lunches will be delivered to the classroom and will be limited. Parents will not be allowed to deliver lunches to the office for students. No microwaves will be available. (Limited options.)

Construction is occurring. Parking spaces may be limited due to teachers and staff parking needs.

Social interaction will be severely limited. Schools will minimize the movement of students in order to increase the safety for all individuals in the building.

Class change protocols and procedures are unknown at this time.
