




ORDER MY MEALS Online for 2020-2021



- . Order student meal kit weekly
 - Meal kits must be ordered by Monday each week for the following week
- No charge for placing an order
 - Reduced and full pay student accounts charged once meals have been received by the student
 - No charge to students approved for free meals and students enrolled in CEP school sites.

Order My Meals in MySchoolBucks

- Create an account on MySchoolBucks
 - No need to create an account if you have an existing <u>MySchoolBucks</u> account, simply log-in to your existing account
- Add enrolled APS student(s) to your account
 - You will need each student's name, school name, DOB, and APS student ID number (this is not the student's meal PIN)
- 3. Order Weekly Student Meal Kits
 - Select the School Store -> Categories -> Meals Orders
 - Select your child(ren) school site's order form
 - Select the student to receive order
 - Select Pick-up at Site or Bus Delivery if applicable
 - Select School Meal Bundle option for the week
 - Each meal kit will contain five (5) breakfast meals and/or five (5) lunch meals
 - Enter your phone number
 - Add order to basket
 - Repeat steps 4, 5, and 6 for each student
 - Checkout and submit your order

These programmes encourage students across the world to become active, compassionate and lifelong learners who understand that other people, with their differences, can also be right.






What does the IBO offer?

The IBO develops three programmes of international education for students aged 3 to 19, working in cooperation with IB World Schools.

Our three programs span the years of kindergarten to pre-university. The programs can be offered individually or as a continuum.

- The Primary Years Program (PYP) for students aged 3 to 12 (Grades 4K-6)
- The Middle Years Program (MYP) for students aged 11 to 16 (Grades 7-12)
- The Diploma Program & Career Path for students aged 16 to 19 (Grades 11-12)





What is the learner profile? It's the IBO mission statement translated into a set of learning outcomes for the 21st century.



The attributes of the learner profile express the values inherent to the IB continuum of international education.

IB programs promote the education of the whole person, emphasizing intellectual, personal, emotional and social development.





What is the PYP (Primary Years Program)? An opportunity for learners to construct meaning.

- Designed for <u>all</u> students aged 4 to 12 (Grades Pre-K-5)
- Designed to foster the development of the whole child.




What curriculum resources will teachers use during remote learning?

- Teachers will continue to utilize Wilson's Language Fundations to address phonics standards and Fountas and Pinnell as our primary resource for English/Language Arts.
- Both curriculum resources contain digital components that allow our teachers to continue to plan rigorous and responsive instruction for students while following the balanced literacy framework.
- Throughout the literacy block, students engage in learning with his/her peers in a variety of instructional contexts. Each context allows students to think, talk, read, and write about authentic texts.

A Design for Responsive Literacy Teaching




What curriculum resources will teachers use during remote learning?

- Teachers will continue to utilize Eureka Math curriculum resources to support student learning of mathematics.
- Eureka Math helps students to connect math through real-world scenarios.
- Through the teaching of mathematics as a story, students are able to process the why behind the math; thus, logically and thoroughly achieving a deep understanding
- ASSISTments and Affirm digital learning applications will allow students to complete practice items that align to the problem sets and exit ticket items in their workbook.
