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IV. Discussion Items

- a. **Discussion Item 1**: Budget Presentation Discussion
 - Budget Choices after initial cluster meeting. Providing feedback prior to Superintendent meeting.
 - Zero based budgeting approach in effect
 - Requested \$288,902 (STEAM coach and STEM lab teacher). Approved signature funds at \$212,432.
 - Coach position, plus \$100 per pupil to cover costs
 - Funding for teachers remains the same. Students per class is 23-24 for 2nd graders, 29 per class for 4th grade
 - Add teachers for 2nd and 4th, drop 2.5 GATE teachers and other adjustments to balance out funding.
 - Learning around SDI and planning for slightly different approach to special education
 - Addison Draper: talk about the role of the interrelated teachers
 - a. Entry level service for special education. Paraprofessional helping in the classroom. Work across a lot of different classrooms and grade levels.
 - Lynley Teras: what about SRO?
 - a. Immovable basically getting it whether its needed or not.
 - Change in FTE school clerk to two hourly positions. Better availability/coverage outside school hours.
 - Becki Heacox: Will it be hard to fill?
 - a. Not really lots of options based on conversations with other schools.
 - b. Retired teachers, parents could definitely be interested.

c.

- Funding STEAM coach with signature funds. Officially in the launching process for certification. Continued funding for MTSS/504 specialist.
- Reduction in School Social Worker
- Keeping Math and Science instructional coach
- Adding an hourly counselor
- Adding a few hourly teacher roles to provide coverage for inperson permanent subs.
- 4 and 5 grade EIP support
- Requested expansion of stipend
- Addison Draper: how does stipend break out for extra curriculars



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- a. Not significant amount of money, but other schools are doing it alright
- Added para subs money
- Addison Draper: is the Gifted teacher position a new one?
 - a. Yes, with longer term plan that they'd move back into being a general ed teacher down the line as we move to different model for GATE.
- Becki Heacox: how different is the money for the hourly position?
 - a. Huge difference a lot of money saved on benefits
- Missy Snyder: did the hourly people get raises last year?
 - a. Yes, but varies by how much
- Kayla Dees: could PE be hourly position?
 - a. Potentially, but doesn't really get us enough savings to warrant it.
 - b. Moving to hourly paras down the line as positions open up.
- Kayla Dees: how would we get subs with hourly?
 - a. It's complicated, but doable
- Pari Ram: there is some money under non-staffing that we're not picking it up. What will happen with this?
 - a. We don't really need the field trip money. Foundation/PTA typically cover our supplies.
- Will hopefully get \$115,000 from leveling (see slides for details on proposed spending)
- Kristy Perez: some money could go towards spending on GATE
- Addison Draper: move the SEL line item to the top, emphasize the implicit bias side in bias training
- Kristy Perez: STEAM funding should include support for the curriculum development
- Kristy Perez: crazy to see #'s for 4th grade when they have to switch.
- Addison Draper: Can we read the strategy questions and keep it moving?
 - a. Yes
- Measuring Impact
 - a. Addison Draper: need to track whether there impactful
 - i. Will definitely track and will also track for the Social Worker position
 - b. Kayla Dees: what the part-time counselor impact looks like



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- Invest in some kind of tool to review success/impact
- c. Pari Ram: If removing .5 EIP, how do we track impact?
 - i. Student achievement data tracking. If we saw it growing, we would revisit next year.
- d. Kayla Dees: Could you hire one person in both roles?
 - i. Yes but it wouldn't save any money
- e. Addison Draper: Can you fill an hourly position on a full-time basis?
 - i. You really can't
- f. \$45,000 security grant will go towards counselor support.
- g. Kristy Perez: making sure we're funding the STEAM priority, which is a priority for cluster
- ii. ACTION ITEM: GO Team vote on Draft Budget
 - Motion (Addison Draper) seconded (Kelsey Boyajian)
 - Unanimously approved
- iii. Staffing conference on February 27th
- iv. Lynley Teras: is there a back off of schools closing?
