What is Title I?

Miles Elementary is identified as a Title I school under Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) effective July 1, 2017. Title 1 is a federal program that provides funding to local school districts to help ensure that all children in district Title I schools meet state's high academic standards. Title I, Part

A provides for substantive parent and family engagement at every level serving students in grades K-12. Section 1116 of the ESSA contains the primary Title I, Part A requirement for schools and school systems to involve parents and family members in their children's education.



School Plan for Shared Student Achievement



What is it? This is a plan that describes how Miles Elementary will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Miles Elementary wants to provide a nurturing, comprehensive, and high performing school where faculty, staff, parents, and all stakeholders will jointly prepare our students to become globally productive citizens and leaders.

How is it developed? Miles Elementary will reach out to parents to get their input about our plan, which is revised annually in the spring. Parents will have an opportunity to complete surveys online or surveys will be sent home at least three times during the school year, so suggestions can be addressed with school leaders in efforts to revise the plan for the upcoming school year.

Who is it for? All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged to become engaged in the parent involvement opportunities. Miles Elementary welcomes all families to events, workshops, and activities.

Where is it available? Once the plan is developed, it will be distributed to stakeholders, and posted on the school's website. It will also be displayed in the parent center, main office, and made available for review at all Title I meetings, workshops, and events.

2021-2022 District Goals:

Develop an academic program that our students will be well rounded individuals, who possess the necessary academic skills and knowledge so that they are ready for college and beyond.

2021-2022 Miles Elementary Goals:

The compact pledges that our school will increase in student academic achievement performance in the areas of Science, Social Studies, Math, and Literacy in order to show an increase in our school CCRPI Score. Our goal is to move from a 54 to 64 CCRPI.

Miles' goals from School Wide Plan are as follows:

- Based on previous state test scores, we are focusing on increasing student achievement points in the areas of ELA by 10%.
- By May 2022, 75% of students in each grade level will meet end of the year goals on identified grade level skills measured by Reading MAP Universal Screener.
- On the spring assessment, 30% of 3rd grades, 30% of 4th graders, and 30% of 5th graders will perform proficient or higher on the Reading EOG Georgia Milestones.

School-Parent Compacts

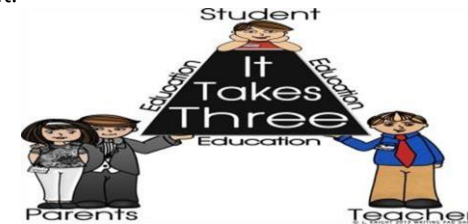
