Therrell HS Strategic Planning Workshop 3.17

Atlanta Public Schools hosted a Strategic Planning session with community members to explore what must be true for schools to achieve the goals of Academic Excellence & Critical Thinking and Life Skills & College and Career Readiness. Participants generated ideas focused on support systems, equity, access, and meaningful school-community collaboration.

Schools

Goal: Academic Excellence & Critical Thinking

- **Shift from test scores to learning**: Emphasize the learning process over standardized outcomes.
- **Rigor with respect**: Promote a culture of high expectations in a supportive, student-respecting environment.
- Culturally responsive teaching: Ensure students see themselves reflected in the content
- **Student-centered learning**: Project-based learning, productive struggle, and differentiated instruction.
- **Social-emotional learning (SEL)**: Integrate SEL practices that support whole-child development.
- **Reduce punitive discipline**: Avoid criminalizing behavior; redefine "insubordination" and related terms.
- Inclusive classrooms: Heterogeneous groupings and fluid pathways for all learners.
- **Teacher development**: Focus on teachers' intellect, skill, and rigor in delivering instruction.

Goal: Life Skills & Career Readiness

- **Student choice & pathways**: Offer access to vocational, college, and military readiness based on student interests.
- Early exposure to career options: Especially in middle school (exploratory courses).
- CTAE certifications: Ensure students can leave high school with tangible credentials.
- Entrepreneurship & financial literacy: Encourage real-world planning, like business plan development.
- **Soft skills training**: Communication, time management, and other real-life competencies.
- Post-secondary planning: Help students design meaningful post-high school plans.
- **Local apprenticeships**: Develop community-based job shadowing and apprenticeship opportunities.

Operations

Goal: Academic Excellence & Critical Thinking

- Facilities that support learning:
 - Safe, welcoming, and clean school environments.
 - Furniture that supports 21st-century learning.
 - Beautification and access to green/sensory spaces.
- After-school program support: Include supper and enrichment aligned with academic goals.
- Equity for special populations:
 - ADA-compliant infrastructure.
 - Support for exceptional education and multilingual learners.

Goal: Life Skills & Career Readiness

- Transportation improvements:
 - Access to internships and career programs.
 - Engage bus drivers in logistics planning.
 - Consider the use of MARTA passes for students.
- Innovation spaces: Labs or makerspaces that foster creativity and real-world skills.
- Life 101 courses: Modernized home economics, health education, and practical life skills.
- Health and wellness services:
 - Mental health support embedded in schools.
 - o In-school clinics with wraparound services.
- Consistent attendance policies: Standardized and enforced across schools.
- **Virtual options**: Enrichment or acceleration with proper tech support.

Community & Family Partnerships

Goal: Academic Excellence & Critical Thinking

- Shared community spaces:
 - Accessible tutoring, mentoring, and workshops.
 - Whole child" services (mental health, therapy, wellness).
- Broad communication strategies:
 - o Multilingual content, user-friendly websites.
 - In-person outreach in neighborhoods, not just at schools.
- Parent engagement:
 - Parenting classes from Pre-K through 12th grade.
- " Make-and-take" resources to support learning at home.
- Peer mentorship:
 - High school students supporting middle/elementary students.
- **GED & Adult Education**: Expand and promote programs for adult learners.
- Vetting of partners: Evaluate effectiveness and alignment of community partners.

Goal: Life Skills & Career Readiness

- **District-wide family engagement framework**: To guide school-family-community collaboration.
- Baseline needs assessment:
 - o Surveys to understand what life skills students lack (e.g., ID, financial literacy).
- Business and workforce partnerships:
 - o Paid internships and apprenticeships.
 - o Cross-cluster and cross-district collaboration.
 - o Support for parents with disabilities or language needs.
- Field trips tied to dreams and exposure: Walkable, local, and tied to career interests.
- Local investment:
 - o List and share businesses for school partnerships and community engagement.
 - o Engage alumni and local leaders intentionally.
