

We are just four Mondays away from the Georgia Milestones End of Course Assessment Exam. All scholars enrolled in American Literature, Algebra, Biology, and U.S. History are required to attend after-school tutorial sessions on *Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 3:45 - 5:00 p.m.*This is an excellent opportunity for scholars to receive additional support as they prepare for these critical assessments.






