• Salary and Benefits up 70%-90% in last 10 years

School size:

If APS had schools with similar student populations as comparison districts, APS would have between 16 and 49 fewer schools.

Staffing ratios

 If APS staffed at ratios similar to other districts, APS would have between 997 and 2,422 fewer staff, and would save between \$120 million and \$293 million

Structures

- Central Office rebound after previous rounds of reductions; large reductions in FY26
- Charter System (School-based Budget Decisions)- inefficiencies in the nature of flexibility, loss of economies of scale in purchasing, requires additional supports, etc.
- Student Success Funding- a per pupil funding formula is optimized when there is sufficient enrollment to generate
 funds sufficient to operate the school. <u>Currently 67% of schools either receive a small school supplement or</u>
 must be built outside of SSF
- Programs, Initiatives, and Supports
- Potential duplication of services through outsourcing, contracts, and vendors

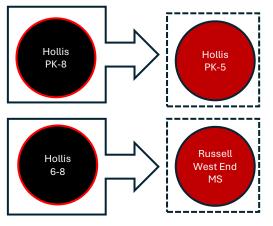

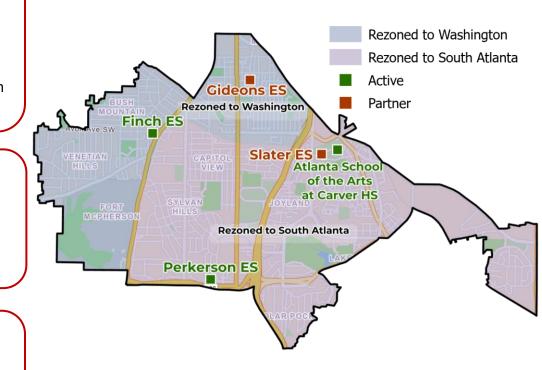
