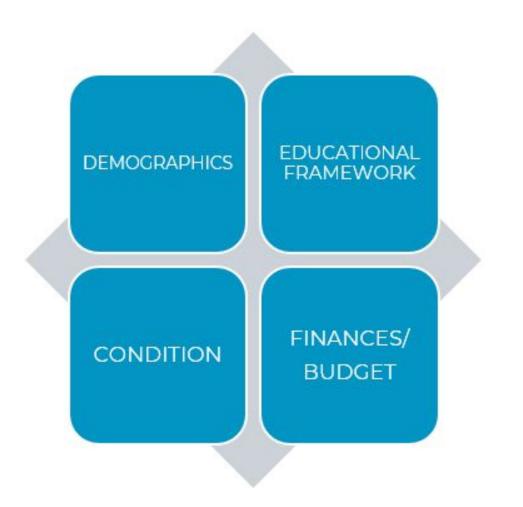

IMPORTANCE OF COMPREHENSIVE PLANNING

Districts across the country are facing the same issues when it comes to facilities planning

- Decreasing (maybe stagnant) birth rates
- Increase in population and housing with little or no student gentrification resulting is lower student housing yields
- Higher instances of Low SES and Transience
- All resulting in lower enrollments
- Increased challenges in hiring teachers and staff (therefore stretching resources beyond capabilities)
- Demand for more programs and services
- Increasing deferred maintenance due to prioritization of scarce funding
- Increasing costs of construction
- Abundance of capacity and facilities

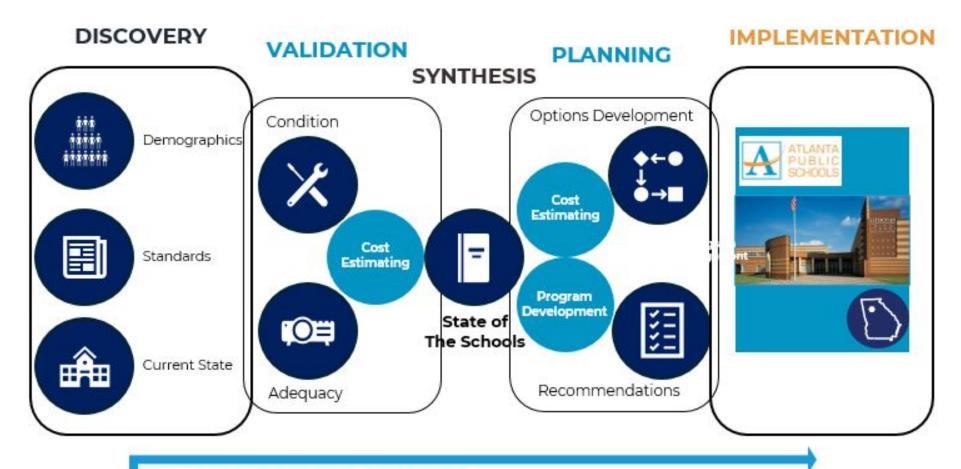
How to Approach these issues:

- Appropriate / Vetted / Trustworthy Data
- Community Engagement from BEGINNING to END of Planning
- Establish Planning Framework (with buy-in) at BEGINNING of the Process
- Create a Facilities Plan FIRST Then create a SPLOST
- Facilities Plan must create a 10-15-year VISION and a 5-year Implementation Plan
- Plan MUST align school facilities to Demographics, to Staffing/Resources, and Financial Ability to maintain

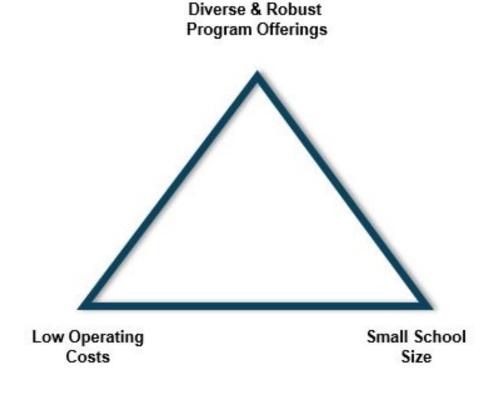

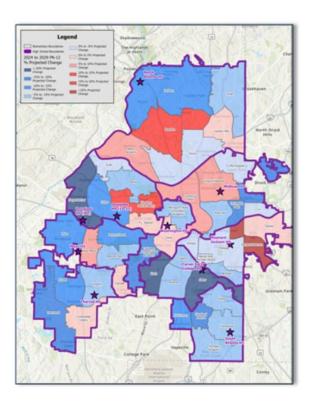

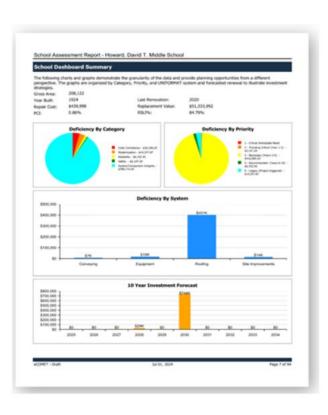
