The school's administrators and teachers have studied our student performance data to decide on the most important areas of improvement for our school. This data is also shared with parents and students. The following goals are 3 of 5 as outlined in the school's improvement plan for the is year:

- By May 2019, 75% of students in each grade level will meet the end of year goal on identified grade level essential skills as measured by the spring administration of the STAR universal screener.
- On the Spring 2019 GMAS EOG, 63% of students in third through fifth grades will achieve the grade level Lexile
- On the Spring 2019 GMAS EOG, 45% of third grade, 45% of fourth grade, and 45% of fifth grade will achieve a reading status of grade level or above.

Our Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is plan describes how **Beecher Hills Elementary School** will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning.
