



What is a Compact?

A compact is a written agreement that explains how parents (or key family members), teachers and students work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards as measured by district and state assessments. We aim to make this an effective compact that does the following:

- Reflect goals identified in the school improvement plan.
- Explain ways teachers and parents (or key family members) will communicate about student progress.
- Identify opportunities for family involvement and engagement.
- · Describe how teachers will help students grow academically using high quality instruction.

A copy of the school-family compact brochure is distributed in multiple ways to every family to use during the year. The Parent and Family Involvement Plan is distributed with the compact. Teachers may use the compact during conferences. The parent's or guardian's written acknowledgement of receiving the compact and parent involvement plan is recorded and kept on file in the school Parent and Family Resource Center, Room 283.

How is the Compact Developed?

The compact is reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from key stakeholders (parents, teachers and staff members) during School-wide Planning meetings and via email and feedback/input forms. Parents and staff members work diligently to create a compact that reflects the Beecher Way, outlined in the school handbook.

Parents are welcome to contribute comments and provide feedback at any time. This can be done in person, by phone, survey, feedback form, or by email to either the Parent and Family Liaison or Title I Contact.



Beecher Hills is proud to be in it's 7th year of the Georgia Department of Education's APTT Cohort II. WestEd's APTT is a classroom-based, teacher-led, data-driven, innovative family engagement model. It is grounded in the notion that schools can thrive when families and teachers work together, as genuine partners, to maximize student learning inside and outside the school. Its research-based infrastructure is rooted in aligning curriculum, instruction, and assessment as it builds the capacity of educators, families, and the community to advance student achievement by linking home and school learning. APTT is focused on building the foundational skills of students in order to reach specific academic goals each school year. We believe the implementation of this model will build the capacity of all stakeholders in a way that will clearly link student achievement to parental involvement. Beecher Hills was the first of a growing number of APS schools that are implementing this model to improve family engagement and student academic achievement.

School administrators and teachers have studied our student performance data to decide on the most important areas of improvement for our school. The following goals are 3 of 5 as outlined in the school's improvement plan for this year:

- \Rightarrow By May 2022, 75% of students in each grade level will meet the end of year goal on identified grade level essential skills as measured by the spring administration of the MAP universal screener.
- \Rightarrow On the Spring 2022 GMAS EOG, 63% of students in third through fifth grades will achieve the grade level Lexile goal.
- \Rightarrow On the Spring 2022 GMAS EOG, 45% of third grade, 45% of fourth grade, and 45% of fifth grade will achieve a reading status of grade level or above.
