Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parental involvement. School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it? This is a plan that describes how Garden Hills will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Garden Hills values the contributions and involvement of parents in order to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. Who is it for? All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Garden Hills Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available? At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the student, registration packet that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will mail the plan to all parents in August before the scheduled Open House event. Parents can also retrieve a copy of the plan in the Parent Resource Center and Main Office.

2014-2015 District Goals

<u>Literacy</u>: By the end of the 2014-2015 school year, increase by 5% the number of students in kindergarten through second grade who read on or above grade level, as measured by the Computer Adaptive Assessment.

<u>Math</u>: By the end of the 2014-2015 school year, increase by 5% the number of students who score at the meets or exceed level on the mathematics portion of the CRCT and EOCT.

2014-2015 School Goals

Increase language proficiency of ESOL students by 7% on the 2015 ACCESS test.
