Welcome to September! We're excited to share with you all the amazing things happenina at our school. Here's what we've been up to and what's ahead:

Academic Focus

Our focus this month is on literacy and reading comprehension. We are continuing to review and unpack the **Flyleaf** reading program, with has an emphasis on Phonics, Fluency, Read Aloud, all while focusing on Data-Driven Instruction. These are critical for supporting our students in becoming strong, confident readers. We are also finishing up MAP for grades K-5 (reading, math and science-5th) and MAP Fluency assessments for grades K-3. These assessments help us identify where each student is on their academic journey and how we can support them best.

Social Emotional/STEAM Focus:

The phrases of the month for August were "Collaborate Strategically" and "Relationship Skills." We encourage students to practice empathy, communication, and cooperation in their daily interactions. Our teachers are reinforcing these skills in classrooms, and we encourage you to support these efforts at home as well. Together, we can help our children grow into intentional, thoughtful, and kind individuals.

Male Mentorship Initiative

We are thrilled to announce that select young male scholars started a male mentorship initiative last weekend with the Men's Ministry at Ebenezer, supported by Mr. Robbins. This program is an incredible opportunity for our boys to learn leadership skills, build character, and foster positive relationships within the community.
