Can the locker be accessed by someone else? Yes, if they give their unique key away.

Are the lockers secure? Each slot of the cell phone storage locker has an independent lock. Each lock is unique for each key, enhancing security.

What if my child needs to call me during the day? APS policy states that students cannot have their phoneon or in use during the instructional day. In the case of an emergency, students can use one of the 37landline phones in our building.Please contact me if you have questions or concerns.
