
## What's unique to an IB classroom?



## IB LEARNER PROFILE ATTRIBUTE FOR THE MONTH: CARING



Developing student agency is one of the most important things we can do as parents and educators to prepare our students for the future. Student agency is about the student taking an active role in their own education. Encouraging student agency helps students take an active role in their own learning, increases their confidence, motivation and interest in activities. Ways to support Student Agency at home: Set goals - These can be academic or personal goals. Setting goals helps students develop awareness, self- discipline, impulse control and stress management. Initiate and take action toward the goals - Create steps to work towards the goal. If the goal is to increase their class averages, set a goal to read or practice math for 15 minutes a day. If the goal is to be more organized, set a goal to clean out your backpack every night and prepare for the day ahead. <u>Reflect and Revise</u> – Check in regularly to see your student's progress toward their goals. Passion Project - If your student seems to not be motivated, they may need a passion project. A passion project can be on anything your student is interested in. Maybe they want to learn to cook or paint? Giving the student the opportunity to pick their own project helps them set goals and expand their interests.




**"IB Spotlight"** Inspirational Figures Embodying the Learner Profile Traits
